Over the weeks all members of the group have explored the theme of 'Journeys' looking at internationally renowned artists such as Richard Long who explore these ideas in their artworks, as inspiration for their new creations.

The young artists have created amazing artworks and objects that will be explored by pupils at Larkrise School. These creations have been made to encourage an exploration of them through all the senses.

Zany binoculars have been designed to explore a giant pathway that has been created entirely out of handmade rocks and a beautiful painted landscape awaits you at the end of the trail.

It is therefore paramount that everyone has access to high quality art experiences as 'every child has but one opportunity for a great education'. After various pilot projects at Larkrise School, the idea of creating installations was validated by various professionals who felt this was an appropriate way for all children to explore art through all the senses. The project was running successfully at Larkrise but we wanted it to be rooted in the Arts and approached the New Art Centre, Roche Court, an Art Gallery with international repute, to support our alternative gallery.

Our partnership is innovative, unique and mutually beneficial. Roche Court Educational Trust (RCET) offer support and a link to the contemporary art world. People who would never have access to a gallery are now exposed to art and artists in ways appropriate to them.

The link between Teachers, Artists and Art Educators is established and truly unique. The model that has developed is so successful that we have now shared it with Exeter House School, The Mead, adults at Ashton Street (now called The Medley), Paxcroft Mead school and Mencap South Wilts.
